

## DRIVING SAFETY COURSE GUIDELINES

Driving Safety Course Dismissals are not available to holders of a Commercial Drivers License (CDL)

### *Safety Course*

#### **DO NOT TAKE THE COURSE BEFORE OBTAINING COURT APPROVAL**

If charged with a traffic offense under the Subtitle C, Transportation Code, a request may be made to take a driving safety course. This option will result in a dismissal once you have complied with all the terms.

You are eligible for a Driving Safety Course if:

1. You do not possess a Commercial Drivers License.
2. You have not completed a Driving Safety Course for ticket dismissal in the previous 12 months (calculated from date of previous completion date to the violation date of your current citation).
3. You have a valid Texas driver's license or permit.
4. You have valid proof of insurance showing you as a Covered Driver.
5. Your violation was not in a construction/work zone with workers present.
6. If cited for speeding, your actual speed must be less than 25mph over the speed limit.

If you are eligible, you may sign up for a Driving Safety Course by sending the following items to the Court or appearing at the Court on or before your appearance date:

1. A copy of your valid Texas Driver's license.
2. A copy of your valid insurance showing You as a covered driver.
3. The Driving Safety Course request citation form Sign and notarized
4. Court Costs amount of \$107.10 **Money Order or Cashier's Check**

**NO PERSONAL CHECKS**

**DO NOT COMPLETE THE COURSE UNTIL THE COURT HAS GRANTED YOU THE PERMISSION TO DO SO.**

Prosecution of the traffic offense will be postponed for 90 days to allow the driver to complete the course and receive a certified driving record copy from the Department of Public Safety. Upon submission of the driving record and proof of course completion, the citation will be dismissed.

Texas Law provides that certain traffic offenses may be dismissed upon successful completion of a driving safety course. To have your case dismissed you must do the following within 90 days by due date.

1) Request a copy of your Driver Record from the Texas Department of Public Safety by completing and mailing the attached form (DPS form DR-1) and requesting driver type Form 3A with a \$10.00 money order for the required fee to **Driver Records Bureau, Texas Department of Public Safety, P.O. Box 149246, Austin, TX 78714** or you can save time and request your Driver Record Online at <http://www.texasonline.com> there is a \$12.00 fee for this.

2) Take a Driving Safety Course from a State Certified Course provider in sufficient time to submit the completion certificate to the Court ON or BEFORE the due date.

3) Present an approved certificate of course completion and your Texas Driver Record, Form 3-A to the Court no later than the date indicated.

THERE WILL BE NO EXTENSIONS! Failure to meet these requirements will result in the fine becoming immediately payable and you will be required to appear at a Show Cause Hearing. Failure to dispose of this matter will result in a warrant being issued for your arrest.
